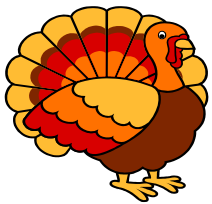

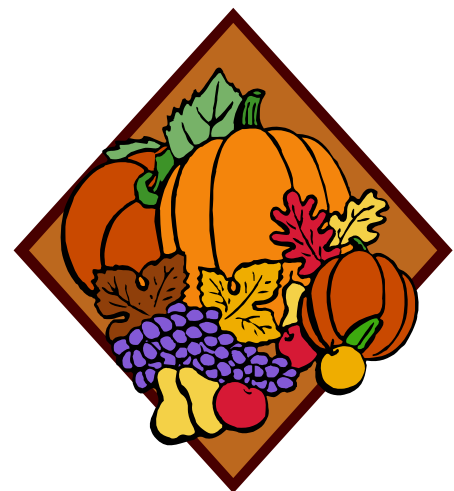

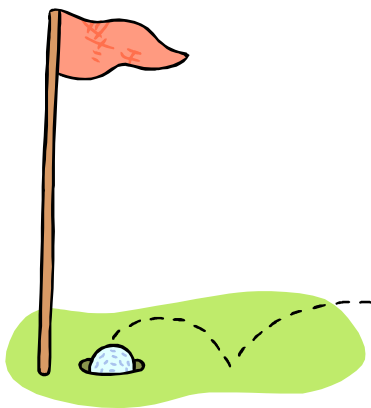

Prepaid Dues Discount for 2004

The Board of Directors approved a 10% discount for members who wish to prepay their 2004 dues and capital improvement fund. Prepaid dues and the capital improvement fund must be paid by November 30, 2003 to receive the 10% discount. After November 30 until December 31st, the discount will be 5%.

If you would like to take advantage of this offer, please send a separate check for the total of 12 months dues and 12 months capital improvement fund plus sales tax of 6.125% less the 10% discount. You may elect to save the discount on either the dues or capital improvement fund or both.

Jim Harvey retired from Bank of American as a financial consultant. Jim was CEO of Lincoln Financial of Arkansas before becoming a financial consultant.

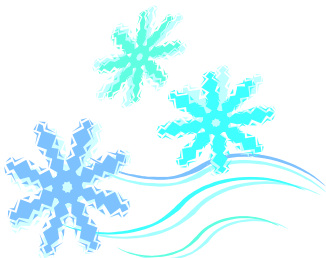
Jim is married to Carole, a professor at UALR. They are members of the Mosaic church. Jim's hobbies are golf, fishing and hunting.

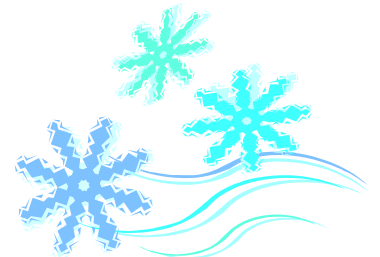

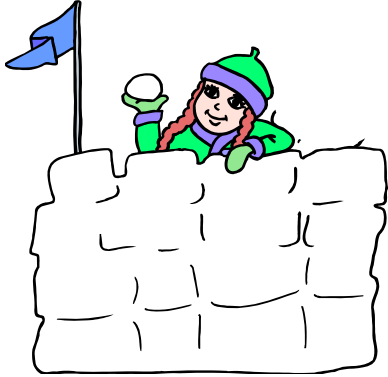
